In terms of image quality, the Sigma 500mm f/4 is excellent, delivering high levels of uniform resolution on all the professional full-frame EOS 5DS R, 1D X Mark II, and 5D Mark IV DSLRs, with no geometric distortion nor problematic chromatic aberration to worry about... Head-to-head against the Canon EF 500 f/4L IS II USM, the Sigma 500mm f/4's image quality compares very favorably. The Canon lens is fractionally sharper on the 5DS R, but the Sigma offers a modest improvement in resolution on the 1D X Mark II and 5D Mark IV. To be fair, there's very little to separate them in real-world terms on any of these DSLRs, however, making the Sigma 500mm f/4 a great value option.
